## 1. SALAH LAKU SEMASA PEPERIKSAAN

### **SECTION A: READING COMPREHENSION (20 marks)**

Text 1 (10 marks)

- It goes without saying that a sustainable campus begins with individuals who are concerned with it. However, many of us are often oblivious to the significance of having a sustainable campus. Generally, the idea of sustainability revolves around meeting the needs of the existing generation without negotiating future needs and it goes beyond looking at stereotyped environmental issues. As listed by the United Nations, the sustainability agenda encompasses three pillars which are environment, economy and society. It further branches out to 17 Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).
- The Universiti Teknologi Malaysia (UTM) has been diligently embracing the challenges in making sure this sustainability agenda continues to be the driving force of UTM's green movement. Back in 2009, this university initiated its first project on the green movement with the launching of two campaigns to kickstart the green future endeavour through sustainable energy. That has marked a turning point in UTM's journey of sustainable growth. Ever since then, there has been no turning back and more thorough plans have been implemented in materialising the long term goals of having a sustainable campus. Each faculty and division in the university is given the responsibility to design, plan and implement initiatives, programmes, projects, and activities under this agenda.
- One of the initiatives is The UTM Campus Living Lab. This initiative has been introduced by UTM to focus on getting students to participate in programmes and activities for establishing a sustainable campus. It has also been introduced as a platform to encourage healthy and productive interactions among stakeholders of UTM at various levels. The UTM Campus Living Lab initiative consists of seven main areas which are Sustainable Arcade, Green Office, Sustainable Energy Management, Bio-Recycling Centre, Green School, Green Community, Sustainable Transport, and Biodiversity. These seven focus areas have been meticulously mapped out to enhance the collaboration and relations between the university and all stakeholders.
- Other than the plans, a comprehensive blueprint has also been produced to determine the directions and goals that UTM has planned. The blueprint thoroughly outlines goals and objectives that will serve as milestones for the university by incorporating sustainability guidelines for UTM staff and students. To achieve this aim, six strategic priority areas (SPA) have been detailed out in the blueprint. They are Net Zero Carbon Campus,

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Ecosystem Resilience, Sustainable Production and Responsible Consumption, Health and Well-Being, SDGs Localisation, and Networking and Partnership.

V The plans and the blueprint have been strategically prepared and produced in the Sustainability Action Plan of UTM Envision 2025 to provide a sustainable and green campus. The efforts taken by each faculty and division in designing, planning and implementing the plans and the blueprint are acknowledged by the university. This acknowledgement is demonstrated through a scheme called the Green Leaf Sustainability Audit. Under this scheme, faculties and divisions that secure high scores for designing, planning and implementing initiatives, programmes, projects, and activities will be awarded handsome rewards. It is hoped that this scheme will continue to instill awareness, readiness and acceptance among the university's citizens and stakeholders on the importance of having a sustainable and green campus, which eventually contributes to the well-being of the communities around the university in general.

- People and communities often choose sustainability in their personal lives for different reasons. So many reasons that it would be **impossible** for us to list them all. However, often it comes back to the single motivation of maintaining the next generation's future. People and communities both now and in the future must continue to create solutions that are sustainable and effective in all terms.
- When it comes to sustainability specifically on a university campus, it is important to introduce students to sustainable actions. This is because they are already being exposed to other ideas and opportunities through what is known as a 'co-curriculum' the kind of learning that takes place outside the classroom. This entails everything from learning about living in a community to the people you meet at the clubs you join to sustainable efforts. These all **create** the centre of what living in a campus environment means. A campus that has a variety of sustainability initiatives often offers students and its other citizens healthier food, community service opportunities, and a creative approach to lifestyle behaviour.
- III So, sustainability on a university campus is important, but how **exactly** can a university promote this to its students? There are several different ways that can be taken to improve university campuses and make them more sustainable. Among them are buying local food to reduce carbon emissions in transporting food, starting a university vegetable garden, starting a bicycle rental programme, installing recycling bins, starting a composting programme, and stopping using disposable items.
