

Part 1

Read the passage below carefully and answer the questions that follow in the answering booklet provided.

- ı When I learnt that my host country was Malaysia, I was thrilled though I did not know about its location, much less about the people and what to expect. I was later told that it is a tropical country situated somewhere in Southeast Asia. Most interestingly, it has a lot of greenery and a multiracial society. That would be a new experience for me, coming far 5 away from Boston. My interest in living with the people and learning about the culture of another country was aroused after attending a talk about the AFS (American Field Service) student-exchange intercultural programme. I would be staying in Malaysia for three months, coinciding with my summer vacation. My elder sister was an AFSer but her host 10 country was England. Malaysia would be a bigger challenge for me, in terms of climate, culture, food and distance.
- 11 After the initial orientation programme and preparations, I found myself together with a number of AFSers on the flight to Kuala Lumpur, the capital of Malaysia. We had more briefings at the welcoming reception, 15 held at the University of Malaya. As my host state was Penang and my foster parents were unable to come to KL, I had to take a bus up north. What a fright I had when the bus met with an accident, and we had to disembark to wait for another bus. It certainly was not a good start, as it 20 was a trying experience for me in the company of total strangers. I was constantly under focus, as if I was an alien from another planet. Nevertheless, some Malaysians were kind or bold enough to ask me a few questions. They must be wondering what I was doing in this part of the world. After a seemingly unending journey, I finally reached Butterworth. Was I glad when I saw my foster family, just like the family

photograph they sent to me earlier.

III My foster family consisted of Pak Ngah, Mak Kalsom and three schoolgoing children, two girls and a boy. I was taken straight to their village, some five kilometers away from Butterworth. The kampong setting is entirely different from that back home. I was greatly fascinated by the traditional Malay houses on stilts surrounded by tall palms and fruit trees. Chickens, goats, and cows added 'colour' to the natural setting. The traditional attire of the villagers caught my attention too. I particularly liked my foster sister's 'baju kurung'. In fact, I was dressed in baju kurung when I came down from the plane that landed in Boston on my return trip. You can imagine the pleasant surprise my parents had when they saw me at the airport. My mother thought I looked beautiful in it and I decided to give it to her. Three days later, I made my family dress in the traditional Malay costumes and fixed a Malaysian meal. Of course, they had to eat with their fingers!

IV Cold days to Malaysians were hot days for me. However, there was plenty of rain here, and in sort of compensated for the heat that I had to endure. I have found that most Malaysians are family-oriented. While at home, the only time my family is really together is at dinner or on vacation. Also in the States, the teenagers seem to have more freedom to go out at night. The education system here is different from that in the States. Although I could not understand Bahasa Malaysia which is the medium of instruction, I gathered that the education system is very much exam-oriented. Back home, I study Biology (Science), Pre-Calculus (Maths), Latin (Foreign Language), English Literature (English) and European History (Social Studies). I also have to choose two of the following electives like home economics, band, chorus, history of art and music, photography, audio-visual aiding, typing, computer processing, industrial arts or mechanical drawing.

V About Malaysian food, I found it to be spicy and 'hot'. What is not the 55 least bit hot for Malaysians is unbearably hot for me, especially for my first few weeks. Most of the time, I had to gulp down cold water to cool off. I have learnt to like some of them though, like Penang laksa, nasi lemak, roti canai, mee rebus and rojak. I also like most of the Malaysians fruits. In fact, I actually like durian, the king of fruits that most foreigners dislike. There are some that I don't quite like though, like the 'cempedak' which has a strong smell. One creature that I was not familiar with was the lizard. There seemed to be plenty of lizards in the home of my foster family as well as the other homes that I went to. I had a difficult time walking 'under' them at the porch and ceiling, lest they 65 dropped on me. Luckily, my room was not infested with them. And of course, there were plenty of mosquitoes, especially at the kampong that I was staying.

VI When I had to leave Malaysia, I found that I had put on at least 8 kilos, no thanks to the wonderful spicy food. To me, Malaysia is the most fascinating and magnificent country. The people here are warm and 70 friendly. The pace of life is very relaxed. I highly recommended for anyone who likes adventure and challenges to Malaysia. I will always cherish the friendship that I have had during my stay in the country. If given another chance, I certainly would like to return to this enchanting country.
